We do that through an annual dividend to the tribe, allocating 37% of our profit to support direct services to the Cherokee people. These services include housing, health care, education and social services. The remaining 63% is reinvested into growing jobs, wages, business development and special projects, such as new construction for health care facilities.

We're motivated by seeing that dividend continue to grow year after year, and we take great pride in knowing that the impact we have is lasting.




FY23 HIGHIS

Last year, we acquired the operating rights of Gold Strike Casino Resort in Tunica, Mississippi, making us one of only a few tribally owned businesses to compete with national casino brands in commercial gaming markets. By expanding our efforts beyond our tribal borders, we're bringing the exceptional service we're known for to more parts of the country while creating jobs and improving the quality of life across the reservation.
